Practice Notes

To: Assistant Registrar, Supreme Court.

The attention of the Chief Justice has been drawn to the fact that the fullest publicity of the Practice Notes is not being afforded to Advocates and Solicitors. With the present shortage of facilities for making copies, this office is not in a position to send a copy to each Advocate and Solicitor in the Malayan Union.
