MOTOR CAR SYCES

The Chief Justice has arranged with the Financial Secretary that any Judge of the Supreme Court, the Registrar of the Supreme Court, and any District Judge, who has been allocated a Government motor car for his duties (i.e. either a BMA car, an Austin 10 H.P.), Station Waggon, or truck is allowed to retain his present Government syce or, if he has not yet employed a syce to so employ one. Each such syce will be a block vote "Head 43, Miscellaneous Services - Secretariat B. Annually Recurrent, Item 8A Petrol, Oil, Lubricants for Government Transport" under the Control of the Financial Secretary. The monthly rate of pay for each syce will be:

<u>Basic pay</u>	<u>Temporary (high cost of living) allowance</u>
\$45.00	\$5.20 if quarters provided. \$6.50 if no quarters provided.

2. The procedure for the payment of each syce will be to submit vouchers to the local Treasury.
3. The above scheme is to commence from 1st June, 1946.
4. In view of this scheme and in view of the fact that all the motor transport now being used by the Judges of the Supreme Court, Registrar, Supreme Court, and District Judges, is owned by Government, and also because petrol and oil are being supplied by Government free for this transport, and all necessary repairs are being done by Government, it is unnecessary until further notice, for any such Judge, Registrar or District Judge to draw any fixed monthly conveyance allowance or mileage.
5. All Registrars and District Judges submit to this office for transmission to the Financial Secretary a list of such syces employed in the Department showing the rates of salary drawn with a note whether they are provided with quarters.
