Criminal Appeals

The Chief Justice, recently, had occasion to
(1)
notice that criminal appeals from District Judges and Magistrates
are indiscriminately entitled A.B. vs. Deputy Public Prosecutor,
A.B. vs Crown Counsel or A.B. vs Public Prosecutor.

2. It must be remembered that the Public Prosecutor
is the correct appellation to be used in all titles to criminal
matters and that "Deputy Public Prosecutor" or "Crown Counsel"
should never be used in such titles.

3. The provisions of section 376(i) F.M.S. Criminal
Procedure Code ⁽²⁾ should be borne in mind.
