Office copies and certified copies

Such copies of public document should be certified by the officer who has the custody of the original by his signature and seal. In the Malay States section 76 of the Evidence Enactment applies and I would accordingly commend that section to your consideration. In the Settlements Order 35 Rule 3 provides for the admissibility of properly completed office copies and in Order 37 Rule 4 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Judicature there is a note in the White Book that all copies xx xx sealed with the seal of the Central Office are to be deemed office copies and xx xx may be received in evidence. The point is that whether the copies denominated are office or certified copies, they should be signed and sealed. (1)
