

The Hon'ble the Chief Justice has directed that the pre-war practice of proclaiming the sittings of the Court should be resumed or instituted in all branches of the Supreme Court.

2. At the beginning of every day's sittings, as the Judge comes onto the bench and takes his seat, the Court usher (or, if there is none, some other official of the Court, normally an interpreter), will, subject to para 3 hereof, pronounce aloud the appropriate one of the following three proclamations:-

(i) COURT OF APPEAL:

Let all those who have concern with the Criminal and Civil Sittings of the Court of Appeal of the Malayan Union draw near and give their attendance.

(ii) CHIEF JUSTICE:

Let all those who have business before his Lordship the Chief Justice draw near and give their attendance.

(iii) JUDGE:

Let all those who have business before his Lordship the Judge draw near and give their attendance.

The above proclamations are appropriate both to criminal and Civil sittings.

3. In Penang and Malacca only the following proclamation will be used for Assizes:-

(iv) All manner of persons having anything to do before My Lord the King's Justice at the Assizes in and for  
 { Penang and all other places subordinate thereto and  
 { Malacca  
 also for all manner of Crimes or offences committed or done within the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court or upon the High Seas draw near and give your attendance.  
 God save the King and My Lord the King's Justice.

4. Where other forms of proclamation are now in use they should be discontinued and the above used instead.
