REGISTRAR'S CIRCULAR NO.19/1947.

COLLECTOR OF ESTATE DUTY'S CERTIFICATES.

When a grant of Probate or Letters of Administration has been issued, it sometimes happens that a corrective affidavit is filed with the Collector of Estate Duty in respect of property not already disclosed and the Collector of Estate Duty sends the Assistant Registrar two copies of his further certificate of payment of duty. One of such certificates is intended to be attached to issue copy and the other to the file copy of the Grant and will form a supplement to the original schedule of property. When so attaching the schedule, an endorsement must be made on the back of the Grant in the following words:

"Supplementary certificate of the Collector of Estate Duty, dated ..... attached hereto.  
Place .....  
Date ..... A.R.S.C. ...."

2. This form of endorsement should be adopted in respect of every additional certificate received from the Collector of Estate Duty.

3. If for any reason the certificate cannot be attached to the issue copy of the Grant, it should not be attached to the file copy either, but retained separately in the file.
