REGISTRAR'S CIRCULAR NO. 28/1947

TRANSPORT & TRAVELLING EXPENSES, 1948.

The administration of this Vote in 1947 has been so difficult that it is necessary to issue special instructions on it.

2. In future payments of Transport and Travelling claims of all judges and district judges will be made at their Head-quarters stations in respect of all routine journeys. E.g. the claims of the Judge at Johore Bahru for assizes at Muar will be paid at Johore Bahru.
3. Visits for Courts of Appeal and to stations outside the Judge's normal area (e.g. to conduct a retrial) will be treated as special and will be paid by the Kuala Lumpur Supreme Court
4. Other charges will be dealt with as at present.
5. Bearing in mind the above you are to submit within 14 days a detailed revised estimate of your requirements for 1948. Points to be taken into account are the withdrawal of Government vehicles, probable new fixed allowances, probable transfers, close estimate of mileage etc. It should be possible on this basis to estimate closely.
6. In some cases liabilities incurred are still not being properly disclosed in monthly returns to me. This throws figures wrong for the whole department. Whether this liability is for goods received or services done, or for goods ordered but not received or services contracted for but not done, this liability must be shown. Any failure to comply with this in future will be treated as a serious breach of duty.
