

REGISTRAR'S CIRCULAR NO: 1/49.

Financial Instructions.

With reference to Registrar's Circular No:17 of 1948 a difficulty has arisen with regard to the note to General Order 214. It has been pointed out that bank paying-in books with double counterfoils are not normally available, unless printed at the constituents' expense. To overcome this, the Court should obtain from the bank a supply of loose paying-in slips in addition to single counterfoil paying-in books. Every time a payment is made, the counterfoil portion of a loose paying-in slip should be made out in the same form as the counterfoil in the paying-in book, and headed "duplicate". The bank's signature and seal will be obtained on this as well as on the counterfoil in the book and the loose one will then be sent to the Treasury while the book is retained in the Court. This has the same practical effect as using a double counterfoil book. The last sentence of the note is modified to this extent only.
