REGISTRAR'S CIRCULAR NO. 1 OF 1952.

Government Uniform Clothing

Uniform rules made under paragraph 4 of
Service Circular No.14 of 1951

Process Servers, Office Boys and Peons, Caretakers and Watchmen, may be supplied annually with 2 suits of uniforms of Khaki or white drill.

2. The recipient of a uniform shall give a receipt therefor either on the reverse side of Local Order or separately.

3. It is the responsibility of the recipients of uniforms to maintain such uniforms in serviceable condition by proper washing and cleaning.

4. All uniforms shall remain the property of the Government and shall be produced for inspection whenever the Head of the Department so requires.


5. Recipients of uniforms shall be in uniform at all times while they are on duty. If any person fails to comply with this rule he should be warned by the Head of the Department and if after two such warnings the person warned still fails to comply with this rule the Head of the Department may withhold the issue of uniforms for the ensuing year.

6. The Head of the Department may require old uniforms to be produced for inspection before issuing new uniforms.

7. The Head of ^{the} Department is empowered to appoint two Senior members of his staff to constitute a Board of Survey, if any, when required to condemn unserviceable uniforms and make recommendations as to its disposal in accordance with F.G. Os. 217 - 223.

8. Every recipient of a uniform shall be liable to make good any loss or damage to any uniform, when such loss or damage is due to his neglect or fault.

9. The Head of the Department may withhold the issue of a uniform to any person who fails to comply with any of these Rules.
