REGISTRAR'S CIRCULAR NO: 2 OF 1969

NOTES OF EVIDENCE

I am directed by the Hon'ble the Chief Justice to request that a serious attempt be made by all Presidents, Sessions Court and Magistrates to write more legibly, neatly and carefully, between the lines. It is appreciated that nobody can write in neat copperplate, especially with speed, but the writing must be easily decipherable, which more often than not is hopelessly illegible. It takes no more time to write legibly, but leads to needless notices of appeal being filed until receipt of legible notes of evidence and in every case imposes a severe strain on any Judge who calls for any record for his inspection.

2. It is also envisaged that applications for notes of evidence will be more frequent, by the use of the Xerox copier and to that end, such notes should be decipherable by all who have occasion to refer to them.
